DISCUSSION AND ACTIVITIES Before reading

The title of this book is *My Dad*, *My Rock*. Do you know what it means to be someone's 'rock'? What could it be?

Look at the illustration on the front and back covers. What kind of story do you think this will be?

After reading

Oliver never met his grandpa, and neither did his dad. Where and how do you think Oliver's dad learned to be a good dad?

Who is your role model? Why?

When Oliver has climbed up on his father's back, he feels like he is safe from everything. Do you have somewhere you go where you feel completely safe? Why is it there?

What does Oliver's dad mean when he tells Oliver about 'teaching a boy how to fish instead of always giving him fish'?

What kind of life lessons would you like to share with your younger siblings or peers?



ACTIVITY

Drawing activity: Card for your rock

Make a card for your dad, or caregiver, explaining them all the things that make them your rock.

Fold a piece of card in half, and on the front, draw a picture of you and them having fun, look at the way Oliver is on his dad's shoulders on the cover of *My Dad*, *My Rock*.

Inside, write a message about how much they mean to you.





ACTIVITY

Colouring activity: Creating a direct transfer

My Dad, My Rock is illustrated in a gentle pencil illustrations. The illustrator, Anna Forlati, has also used lots of different shading and textures to create depth in her artwork.

Now, let's try making your own textured drawing!

Find a small object with an interesting texture on its surface (a coin will work well!). Slide it under a piece of blank paper, and shade in the area on top. When you take the object away, you will be left with a textured image of the object!
